1. In the process of besieging Jerusalem, the Babylonians had broken down the walls of Jerusalem ([2 Kgs. 25:8-10](#))
2. As the book of Nehemiah opens, Nehemiah is informed of the status of Jerusalem ([Neh. 1:1-3](#))
 - a. The king who reigned then was Artaxerxes I Longimanus who reigned from 464-424 B.C. ([Neh. 2:1](#))
 - b. There was work to be done to restore the walls of Jerusalem

I. Plan the Work

1. Nehemiah inquired of the work to be done ([Neh. 1:1-3](#))
 - a. The wall of Jerusalem was broken down and the gates burned with fire ([Neh. 1:3](#))
2. Nehemiah went to the king for specific requests ([Neh. 2:1-5](#))
 - a. Nehemiah had a definite time in mind ([Neh. 2:6](#))
 - b. Nehemiah planned for safe passage ([Neh. 2:7](#))
 - c. Nehemiah requested needed building supplies ([Neh. 2:8](#))
3. Nehemiah laid eyes on the work to be done ([Neh. 2:11-16](#))
 - a. It is one thing to hear about something, another to see it for yourself
4. Nehemiah encouraged the people to work the plan ([Neh. 2:17-18](#))
 - a. There will always be naysayers ([Neh. 2:19-20](#))

II. Work the Plan

1. Nehemiah and the people began rebuilding the wall ([Neh. 3](#))
 - a. The high priest and priests worked ([Neh. 3:1](#))
 - b. Some refused to work ([Neh. 3:5](#))
 - c. Goldsmiths, perfumers, and merchants worked ([Neh. 3:8, 31-32](#))
 - d. Leaders worked ([Neh. 3:9, 16, 18-19](#))
 - e. Some did the dirty work ([Neh. 3:14](#))
 - f. Levites worked ([Neh. 3:17](#))
 - g. Temple servants worked ([Neh. 3:26](#))
2. Everyone is needed in the church to work ([Eph. 4:16](#))
